St. Odilo Church is the only parish in the United States dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory. It was founded and sanctioned as the Shrine of the Poor Souls by His Eminence, George Cardinal Mundelein, in 1928, with a special indulgence of 200 days granted upon each visit to the shrine.

Passion Week

This Sunday, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, was traditionally called "Passion Sunday." After the joy of Laetare Sunday, the Church entered more deeply into the Lenten season by considering intensely the Passion of our Lord. Passion Week then, of course, leads into Holy Week, the commemoration of Jesus's suffering, death and Resurrection. We are coming closer and closer to the holiest week of the Church's liturgical year.

One of the features of Passion Sunday is that we cover the images of Christ and the saints with violet veils. The *Catholic Encyclopedia* of 1917 explains the meaning of this symbol.

The crosses are veiled because Christ, during this time, no longer walked openly among the people, but hid himself. Hence in the papal chapel the veiling formerly took place at the words of the Gospel: "Jesus autem abscondebat se." Another reason is added by Durandus, namely that Christ's divinity was hidden when he arrived at the time of His suffering and death. The images of the saints also are covered because it would seem improper for the servants to appear when the Master himself is hidden (Nilles, "Kal.", II, 188).

Furthermore, the hidden images remind us that there were no saints in heaven until Jesus opened the way to heaven by His death and resurrection. Until that salutary event, the holy people lived in peace but had not yet seen the Face of God. Their images are veiled in church because they were "veiled" from the presence of God until Christ rose from the dead. That is the meaning of the phrase in our Creed, "he descended among the dead." He entered into their realm to bring them into heaven.

As we look upon the veiled images in church these next two weeks, we are reminded that our hearts and minds are veiled from God also. We live as pilgrims here on earth because our true home is in heaven. Our intellect, our will, our hearts are darkened to greater and lesser degrees because we do not see God face-to-face as He really is. We live for the day when we can see God as He really is and enjoy His presence forever.

Semana de La Pasión

Este domingo, es el Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma, se llamaba tradicionalmente "Domingo de Pasión". Después de la alegría del domingo de Laetare, la Iglesia entró más profundamente en el tiempo de la Cuaresma al considerar intensamente la Pasión de nuestro Señor. La Semana de la Pasión entonces, por supuesto, conduce a la Semana Santa, la conmemoración del sufrimiento, la muerte y la Resurrección de Jesús. Nos acercamos cada vez más a la semana más santa del año litúrgico de la Iglesia.

Una de las características del Domingo de Pasión es que cubrimos las imágenes de Cristo y los santos con velos violetas. La Enciclopedia Católica de 1917 explica el significado de este símbolo.

Las cruces están cubiertas con un velo porque Cristo, durante este tiempo, ya no caminaba abiertamente entre la gente, sino que se escondía. De ahí que en la capilla papal el velamiento tuviera lugar antiguamente con las palabras del Evangelio: "Jesús autem abscondebat se". Durandus agrega otra razón, a saber, que la divinidad de Cristo estaba oculta cuando llegó en el momento de su sufrimiento y muerte. Las imágenes de los santos también están cubiertas porque parecería impropio que los sirvientes aparecieran cuando el Maestro mismo está escondido (Nilles, "Kal.", II, 188).

Además, las imágenes escondidas nos recuerdan que no había santos en el cielo hasta que Jesús abrió el camino al cielo con Su muerte y resurrección. Hasta ese saludable acontecimiento, el pueblo santo vivía en paz, pero aún no había visto el Rostro de Dios. Sus imágenes están cubiertas en la iglesia porque estaban "cubiertas" de la presencia de Dios hasta que Cristo resucitó de entre los muertos. Ese es el significado de la frase en nuestro Credo, "descendió entre los muertos". Él entró en su reino para llevarlos al cielo.

Al mirar las imágenes cubiertas en la iglesia durante las próximas dos semanas, se nos recuerda que nuestros corazones y mentes también están escondidos de Dios. Vivimos como peregrinos aquí en la tierra porque nuestro verdadero hogar está en el cielo. Nuestro intelecto, nuestra voluntad, nuestro corazón se oscurecen en mayor o menor grado porque no vemos a Dios cara a cara como realmente es. Vivimos para el día en que podamos ver a Dios como realmente es y disfrutar de su presencia para siempre.

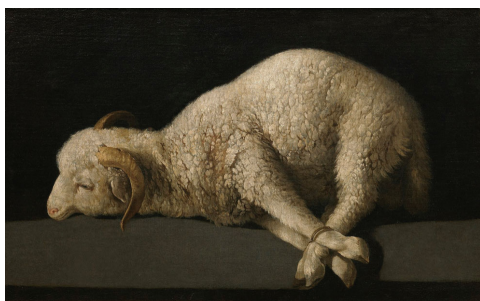

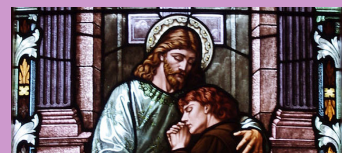
